NURSING EDUCATION ANNUAL REPORT

Fiscal Year 2023-2024



The North Dakota Board of Nursing is recognized by the United States Department of Education as the state approval agency for nurse education in North Dakota.

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Overview and Methodology

The North Dakota Board of Nursing (NDBON) requires each approved prelicensure nursing education program to submit a comprehensive annual report. Data for the fiscal year (FY) 2023-2024 report was collected by the NDBON in collaboration with the National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN) in fulfillment of continuing compliance monitoring for ongoing approval of North Dakota nursing education programs in accordance with NDAC 54-03.2-07-09. The report provides a descriptive analysis of all data collected. Aggregate data collected from each NDBON approved nursing education program for this report is from the time period established in NDAC between July 1, 2023, and June 30, 2024.

All annual nursing education program data submitted is reviewed and evaluated for compliance with *NDAC Article 54-03.2 Standards for Nursing Education Programs*. Required data submitted by program nurse administrators for the comprehensive annual nursing education report aligns with U.S. Department of Education requirements for ND Board of Nursing recognition as a nationally accredited agency for approval of nurse education in North Dakota.

According to *NDAC Section 54-03.2-07-09 (2a.)* ND Board of Nursing approved nursing education programs are reevaluated at a minimum of every five years to ensure compliance with the standards for nursing education. A program that holds national nursing accreditation may seek the Board's approval through a paper survey process if the program received full approval following an onsite survey of no more than five years prior, if quality indicators remain constant as evidenced by the information provided in the NDBON Annual Nursing Education Report submission, and if the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX®) pass rate for first-time test takers has remained above 80% in three of the last four years. If a program does not hold national nursing accreditation, an onsite survey is required every five years. Survey information and Board-related actions are described in the *Programmatic Summaries by Institution* section at the end of this report.

Statistical data detailed in this report includes current and historical data about students, education program capacity, curriculum, graduates, NCLEX® results, and faculty for each nursing education program. Data and information included for each approved program includes 1) progress toward achievement of stated program objectives 2) qualifications and major responsibilities of the nurse administrator and each faculty member 3) current enrollment by class and student-teacher ratios 4) number of admissions per year for the past five years 6) number of graduates per year for past five years 7) curriculum plan 8) descriptions of resources and facilities, clinical areas and contractual arrangements.

Each program provides comprehensive information regarding practice facilities utilized for clinical practice experiences. Over 250 different entities in North Dakota are utilized by approved nursing programs to meet student clinical practice experience requirements. Performance of students on state board examinations is monitored by the NDBON quarterly through NCLEX® reports provided by NCSBN and Pearson VUE. The past year and ten-year trend NCLEX® statistics are included in the report for practical and registered nurses. The report also includes quarterly data submitted by programs utilizing *NDAC 54-03.2-04-08.1 Faculty Developmental Program* during the fiscal year. The Faculty Developmental Program rules allow programs with Board approval to utilize baccalaureate prepared faculty who are continuously enrolled and progressing in a graduate nursing education program. Programs may have up to fifteen percent of faculty full-time equivalents or one faculty full-time equivalent for a program with seven or fewer faculty who are academically unqualified per NDAC.

Each nursing education program is required to submit a current academic year course catalog for review. This report includes information throughout that verifies the collection of a current academic year course catalog from each of the nursing education programs. Information verified using the course catalog and referred to within the report includes but is not limited to national nursing accreditation, student and

academic policies, clinical practice related policies including immunization, background check policies, courses, library resources and admission, progression and graduation policies and curriculum design.

A student handbook or program brochure that includes student policies for selection, progression (promotion) and graduation was provided with each program's annual report data and policies and procedures were reviewed and verified. Each program also provided an explanation of the way the program safeguards student health and safety and procedures for the safety and wellbeing of enrolled students with the annual data, which were reviewed and verified. Finally, each program submitted yearly fiscal budget information that was reviewed and analyzed for comparability with the most recent annual and survey report submissions and alignment with programmatic change requests as applicable.

A narrative summary is provided for each of the approved nursing education programs which includes budgetary details submitted by the program and program related Board actions for the fiscal year including major programmatic changes and notifications, innovative nursing projects, program surveys and/or compliance reports.

United States Department of Education Grants North Dakota Board of Nursing Continued Recognition as State Approval Agency for Nurse Education

The NDBON was first recognized by the DOE as an approval agency for nurse education in the State of North Dakota in 2002 for a period of two years and has been continuously recognized nationally since that time. The most recent review of the agency for renewal of its recognition occurred between January 2020 to September 2021. DOE staff virtually observed NDBON survey staff during several nursing program surveys during the review period as part of the recognition renewal review process. The NDBON is one of only five Boards of Nursing in the U.S. that are recognized by the DOE as specialized accrediting agencies.

The United States Department of Education (DOE) Deputy Under Secretary, Jordan Matsudaira, notified the North Dakota Board of Nursing (NDBON) on May 20, 2022, of his decision to approve the agency's request for renewal of recognition.

The National Advisory Committee on Institutional Quality and Integrity (NACIQI) met on February 23, 2022, to consider the DOE staff analysis report and recommendation related to the NDBON petition for continued recognition. NACIQI unanimously recommended approving the NDBON request for renewal of recognition at the meeting. Mr. Matsudaira concurred with the recommendations of DOE staff and NACIQI and granted the NDBON continued recognition as a statewide programmatic accreditor of nurse education programs in North Dakota for a period of four years.

The North Dakota Board of Nursing is legally authorized to regulate nurse education programs in the state of North Dakota under the Nurse Practices Act, NDCC and NDAC. The NDBON presently approves three graduate level nursing education programs, seven baccalaureate programs and five associate degree programs designed to prepare individuals for registered nurse licensure. In addition, the NDBON approves three associate degree programs and four certificate programs for practical nursing. Recognition by the DOE enables professional nurse education programs to seek eligibility for federal assistance pursuant to the Nurse Training Act of 1964, as amended. Recognition by the DOE ensures quality, accountability, and improvement of survey processes for the NDBON and provides reassurance to North Dakota citizens about the quality of nursing education programs in the state.

The DOE provides oversight of the postsecondary accreditation system through its review of all federally recognized accrediting agencies. The DOE holds accrediting agencies accountable by ensuring that they enforce their accreditation standards effectively. Also, as a part of the DOE's oversight roles, the Secretary of Education is required by law to publish a list of nationally recognized accrediting agencies that the Secretary determines to be reliable authorities as to the quality of education or training provided by the institutions of higher education and the higher education programs they accredit. The U.S. Secretary of Education also recognizes State agencies for the approval of public postsecondary vocational education and nurse education.

Practical Nurse Education Programs

Education Curriculum

Credit hours required for graduation from NDBON-approved one-year certificate and diploma practical nurse (PN) programs ranged between 42-43 semester credit hours. The required course credit hours are shown in the tables below. Most clinical practice experiences for PN programs took place in the clinical practice environment and ranged between 47%-86% of the total clinical practice hours required for degree completion. The use of simulation technology as an adjunct to clinical practice experiences ranged between 6%-17% of total clinical practice hours required for degree completion, while skills lab practice experiences ranged between 8%-43% of total clinical practice hours required.

Credit hours required for graduation from NDBON approved associate degree practical nurse (PN) programs had a range of between 66-70 semester credit hours. The required course credit hours are shown in the tables below. Most clinical practice experiences for PN programs took place in the clinical practice environment and ranged between 47%-85% of the total clinical practice hours required for degree completion. The use of simulation technology as an adjunct to clinical practice experiences ranged between 7%-23% of total clinical practice hours required for degree completion, while skills lab practice experiences ranged between 8%-31% of total clinical practice hours required.





Age

Most practical nurse students in FY 2023-2024 were reported as being in the age range of 25-30 years old for the third consecutive year. Previous years the average reported age was 24 and below. Student age has been gradually increasing within practical nurse programs over the past ten years.

Racial Composition



Graduate Percentage by Certificate & Diploma Practical Nurse Program


Ten Year Graduate Trend for Certificate & Diploma Practical Nurse Programs





Graduate Percentage by Associate Degree Practical Nurse Program




Ten Year Graduate Trend for Associate Degree Practical Nurse Programs











Graduate Percentage by Associate Degree Registered Nurse Program






Ten Year Graduate Trend for Associate Degree Registered Nurse Programs




Graduate Percentage by Baccalaureate Degree Registered Nurse Program















Innovative Educational Model/Approach:

January 2021 the Board approved the Dakota Nursing Program Consortium partner, Lake Region State College (LRSC) application for an Innovative Educational Model/Approach of a Nurse Apprenticeship Program for the Practical Nursing Certificate and Associate of Applied Science in Nursing Programs through January 2022. Implementation of the PN Nurse Apprenticeship Program was proposed to begin fall 2021 and the RN Apprenticeship Program to begin fall 2022.

Initial approval of the Innovative Model required the program's nurse administrator to submit a progress report bi-annually for continued approval of the Model. The reports were required to provide evidence that desired outcomes were being met, and public protection was not compromised. Progress reports were required to conform to the criteria set forth in the evaluation plan for the Nurse Apprenticeship Program.

Progress reports were submitted to the NDBON as required July 2023, and January 2024. The July 2023 progress report described the continued work accomplished to secure facility partners and affiliation agreements, as well as an update on student progress and enrollment in the apprenticeship programs. The January 2024 progress report described the continued work accomplished to secure additional facility partners and complete affiliation agreements. The number of PN and ADN students who completed the apprenticeship program, including some demographics, were detailed. A summary was provided detailing components of student and employer satisfaction, including mentor relationships. Several areas of improvement were noted that have been or are being addressed as part of the continuous quality improvement effort.

July 2023 the Board approved the Dakota Nursing Program Consortium partner, Bismarck State College (BSC) application for an Innovative Educational Model/Approach of a Nurse Apprenticeship Program for the Practical Nursing Certificate and Associate of Applied Science in Nursing Programs through July 2024. Implementation of the PN Nurse Apprenticeship Program was proposed to begin fall 2024 and the RN Apprenticeship Program fall 2025.

The Consortium Director was required to submit a progress report bi-annually, in January and July. The progress report submitted in January 2024 described efforts in the past four months to develop the program and identify facility partners. BSC worked to market the programs and educate about them. Increased marketing efforts were planned upon finalization of the first facility affiliation agreement. A mentor guide was in the process of being developed to use to orientate facility mentors. Students will be required to register as UAPs during their time in the apprenticeship program.

The Board found the progress updates from both institutions met the reporting requirements and in January 2024 granted continued approval of the LRSC Innovative Model through January 2025, with biannual reports due June 2024, and December 2024. The biannual program progress reports for each

institution provided information about ongoing implementation efforts and did not indicate that students were adversely impacted by the innovation.
