American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC) announced in 2011 that they would no longer award CE for renewal courses for Certification for courses such as PALS and ACLS. In May 2011 the board agreed to follow ANCC requirements and not accept the renewal courses for certification. The board office has been made aware that ANCC has recently reversed that decision and is now awarding CE for renewal courses. The Nursing Education Committee reviewed and discussed the issue and felt that there is not enough new content in a recertification course to meet the requirement of the CE policy. The Continuing Education renewal policy states: Unacceptable subject matter or course contents that DO NOT MEET the CE requirement in ND includes Advanced Skills Renewal Courses (ACLS, PALS, NALS, etc).
