The Board contacted the NDDoH in February 2017 requesting an update on the physician assuming the authorization of the Chlamydia and Gonorrhea standing orders for continued compliance with the November 2016 Board motion. Ms. Brandner requested the Board accept authorization of the Chlamydia and Gonorrhea standing orders by various clinic medical directors in lieu of the State Health Officer. Board members expressed concern related to removal of State Health Officer authorization of these specific orders. According to NDCC 23-01-05 STATE HEALTH OFFICER if the governor does not appoint as a state health officer a physician licensed in this state, the governor shall appoint at least three licensed physicians recommended by the state medical association to serve as an advisory committee to the state health officer.
